MOA

- Family and social network is central to reintegration into community
- Should be viewed as part of rehabilitation

Family & Social

Network

Strain placed on support networks is significant: breakdown of relationships is common. This often leads to isolation

Support networks need more support including knowledge of ABI and of services available

Hidden

Disability



- · Difficult to assess individuals without visible or obvious impairments
- Difficulty in assessing compounded by Professionals' lack of knowledge

Cognitive changes can include irritability, aggression, loss of empathy: these can viewed simply as personality traits



Impact of ABI can be very varied: meaning it's likely individuals will work with an array of professionals

 These services often work together inadequately: poor communication and lack of co-ordination

· Lack of collaborative working impacts individual's recovery; and reinforces divides between professionals
